As treasurer I am very proud of the accounting of the funds that flow though our bank account. Now that may sound like a strange statement so let me share with you some of that process. First, as treasurer I am part of a team that handles those funds. June, our bookkeeper, does the recording of all income and expenses through a QuickBooks program. I make the payments for our expenses and receive the income. The records are given to June who enters that data into the program. Several reports are submitted to the Presbytery Office who monitors our flow of money and quarterly sends Mattole a \$500 grant. We received \$2000 in 2012 from them.

Monthly reports are presented to the Council that show balances of the checking and savings accounts. Also, periodic evaluations are reported of the financial status based on the budget that was approved by the Council for the fiscal year.

Now all of this might seem pretty dry to the average user of Mattole, but for your treasurer it is very fascinating. The QuickBooks program is so detailed that every dollar coming in and going out of Mattole is accounted for. I hope this gives the folks who use the camp and those supporting the camp with their time, abilities and dollars, a great confidence that their support is well received and utilized.

Each year for Mattole varies with respect to users and costs. This year we were blessed with user dollars that exceeded our budgetary forecast. We had income from two weddings that were not expected, but made up for some lower attended camps. We know of a group that normally comes in February has been dissolved and will never return.

Some of our facilities are starting to need major repairs. Sun-Up Cabin required guite a bit of work before it was usable for the summer season. Sun-Down Cabin will need some major work soon. Seldom Inn could use some TLC. Even The Lodge had door problems this summer. On it goes. Keeping the Camp functioning requires supplies and skilled labor.

We do celebrate the existence and use of Mattole Camp as a place where people meet God. We do celebrate the support that so many give for the upkeep and operation of the Camp. We do celebrate the hope we as a Council have for the success for a new camping season for 2013.
