Lee Dedini wonders... NO WATER FROM THE FAUCET???

Last winter a group of us went out to Mattole on one of the wettest days of the year to complete the work on the new wood stove brickwork. The rain had been torrential with streams of water flowing in back of the lodge. We had been there about an hour when someone said there was no water out of the faucet. Christine, the caretaker, arrived back with the answer. The hillside water system had been washed down the hill. A slide above the spring box moved earth and rock down the ravine taking all the 2" water lines down to the fire pit area. Fortunately the water tanks did not receive damage. We continued making our mortar for the brickwork by collecting rain water in buckets from the overflowing gutters. Then we found out a tree had slid down blocking the road on the entrance road to the camp. Well, we were planning to spend the night anyway. With some chainsaw work and equipment help from Jay with Mattole Valley Nursery the road was cleared.

Other trips were made for the replacement of the spring box and water lines. Jay's crew returned with equipment and loads of fill dirt to clean up and repair the fire pit area. The new spring box continues to supply ample water flow which is very encouraging.

We are thankful that we could repair the damages that occurred. We also continue to work on improvements to maintain the camp for many years.

THANK YOU TO OUR VOLUNTEERS Who come out to the camp each year and work on everything that we can possibly fit in! Our days start early, with coffee and quiet chat on the deck, then breakfast, then WORK, lunch, MORE WORK, maybe sneak in a river romp, MORE WORK, appetizers, cocktails, dinner, dessert and a rousing game of cards all followed by well-needed sleep... We do love it out there!!! This year our accomplishments included: water system upgrade, lodge roof repair, river steps reinstalled and uprights reinforced, skirting around shop & PP Palace, deck boards replaced (lodge & Tree deck), all cabins cleaned, new caps on lodge railing, cleaned up mudflow/silt around the lodge, installed spark arrestor, decobbed most buildings, restocked all cleaning supplies in cabins, fixed shop ramp, fixed oven pilots (lost one lighter!), relocated our extra fridge, added downspouts on main lodge center front/back, rebuilt fire pit, replaced cross, built clay dam for spring box, checked water!, landscaped around lodge, weeded the pergola bricks, we passed our annual inspection, reorganized lodge kitchen, fixed sanitizer, a couple of toilets.. I love the scent of Mattole Camp! It's a mixed bag of freshly cut grass, warm breezes, wet wood, and flowing river. The air is full with a sense of wonder and peace. I contemplate all the improvements we've made, and all that still needs to be done. And I think about money.

2019 was, generally, a financially sound year with the exception of the rain-drenched setbacks. The rainfall proved to be both a blessing and a curse.
